Thanks for the email. The first question I planned to ask you if we talked was if you wanted to just give me your email address so we can keep a clear documented history.

I will send a more substantial reply later, but for now wanted to just ask a quick question on this use of the word "substantiated". You see, my Line of Business has been horribly uncooperative not only about the Accountability Board process, but in the past year and a half about the refusal to "substantiate" the details of their alleged concerns about me, the records they have produced (which, apparently, are virtually none), etc. So, when you wrote "...once an allegation is substantiated and management decides to propose an action...", it draws me straight to the key questions I have for you:

If any of the allegations against me were "substantiated", what was used to "substantiate" them, and who did this "substantiation", and when?

Do you have any other documents in the Accountability Board Case File you are keeping (per Order 1110.125A), that either preceded the ROI or followed the ROI? If so, can we avoid a prolonged FOIA delay and be less bureaucratic in the discovery process so critically needed right now? At a minimum, can you at least provide me with a list...subject, author, date...so I can know if we even have anything in the file appropriate for discovery? (Or, if the list is shockingly long, how about just the number of pages and documents and the dates added?)

Please email back ASAP as my clock is ticking, thanks to the latest from Air Traffic.
