Jeff,

I know that you have had questions about the status of your grievance. After grievances are elevated, the Agency is in the position to provide a response (denying the grievance or sustaining the grievance). If the Agency does not provide a response, the Union can then elevate the matter to the arbitration level once the time for a response lapses. Since the Agency did not provide a response at the Regional level, the Union has elevated your issue to the arbitration level. I have attached the letter we sent to Melvin Harris, the FAA's Director of Employee and Labor Relations.

We will keep you updated if there are any further developments.

Based upon our conversations, it is my understanding that you will utilize the MSPB processes to address your removal if, upon reviewing your response, the Agency chooses to implement its proposal.
